Where We Operate: South Africa and Zimbabwe

- We provide funding, school fees, and boarding for 18 children in South Africa and Zimbabwe to attend highquality education programs
- DTCare is working to provide jobtraining focused on sustainability and work in a low-carbon economy.
- Continuing to provide medication and support to HIV patients in Zimbabwe



Where We Operate: Lebanon

- DTCare is focused on law enforcement capacity building, hazardous waste disposal, and sustainable energy infrastructure.
- DTCare launched a medical supply distribution program and shipped 5900 kg of equipment in 2021.
- In 2021, DTCare and partner groups distributed over 1,000 food packs to people in Beirut, Tripoli, and other areas
- Implemented the WILD Program, managed by women, for the advancement of human rights and to properly address issues most affecting women



Where We Operate: Panama

- DTCare relocated the David medical clinic to the town of Monte Lirio, on the Costa Rican border and hired a new clinician to manage the office.
- In response to COVID-19 school closures, DTCare opened a free community school where children without access to online school services can receive an education from a licensed educator.
- DTCare opened a home for single mothers, who can live in the home free of charge as long as needed to escape dangerous or unsafe situations.
- Raised \$3,291 at a fundraiser for the women of the home to further their education or support their small business plans



Where We Operate: Bosnia & Herzegovina

- DTCare partnered with the University of Sarajevo to host a workshop to improve beekeeping, biosecurity, and nutritional aspects of bee-products.
- Offering women's empowerment through creating awareness and promoting inclusivity systematically.
- Planning for biosecurity in the Balkans; developing scenarios and response-types to curb virulent pathogens.
- Promoting unity and camaraderie with community partners through projects.
- Implementing disarmament processes.
